

Good Evening Commission Members, in regard to Docket #PF15-6-000.

My name is John Zawatsky speaking to you as a private property owner on the East of Lovington Alternative pipeline route - 1482 Hill Hollow Road.

I'd like to put each of you in my place at the podium for the next few minuteshere's YOUR story--

You've received 2 Notices of Survey from ACP & looked at the alternative route on-line. The 125-ft. wide pipeline construction corridor slices your 4 acres NW to SE coming within 20 feet of your back door. The 42" diameter high volume / high pressure gas pipeline would be buried about 75 feet from your back kitchen porch.

Your neighbor to the NW owns 40 acres of steeply sloped forested hillsides containing mature oak / hickory & beech trees. This majestic forest will have a 125 ft. wide construction clear cut thru it. The 40 acres also contains springs, seeps and a mountain stream that would be cut in half - All this water empties into the small freshwater pond located on your property.

Your property is next - Your hardwood trees, your driveway, your home's water well & water line up to the house will be destroyed inside the 125 ft. wide construction zone. The excavations, earthmoving, digging & heavy equipment activity will not allow you to access your own home--because your driveway will be gone. No more water for your home and no way to get to or from your home.

Your neighbor to the SE has a Conservation Easement on their 100 acres. These private property owners are prohibited from cutting their trees, they can't excavate, dig, grade or ditch their land. It's sad to know that Dominion & ACP might be able to conduct these activities with the 125ft. construction corridor spilling onto their land.

As the lead Federal Review & Regulatory Commission you must demand that Dominion & ACP propose realistic and credible alternatives on existing routes, not the original proposed pipeline route from last year or the recently announced alternatives from Feb. 23rd.

During your review, require that Dominion & ACP identify and plan any pipeline route to use existing easements **NOT** new ones from private citizens. Tell them to highlight **RIGHTS OF WAY** with existing utilities, roads & related dedicated access already in place. Has Dominion & ACP done any of this

planning???

I consider Dominion's and ACP's work to date on pipeline routes and announced alternatives totally lacking, inadequate and failing in every way. Unless you, the Commission, get more complete and comprehensive information on options to the announced routes, it is your obligation to **DENY** any pipeline project proposed by Dominion & Atlantic Coast Pipeline.
